### Biography

Morris Steggerda was born on September 1, 1900, in Holland, Michigan, to John and Sena (Ter Vree) Steggerda. He obtained his A.B. at Hope College in 1922 and his A.M. and Ph.D. (1923, 1928) from the University of Illinois, in the Department of Zoology. From 1928 to 1930, he was an assistant professor of Zoology at Smith College (Northampton, Massachusetts); from 1930 to 1944, he was an investigator with the Carnegie Institution to Washington at Cold Spring Harbor (Long Island); thereafter, until his death, professor of Anthropology at Hartford Seminary Foundation (Connecticut). He was a member of Sigma Xi, Gamma Alpha, American Zoological Society, American Association for the Advancement of Science, American Society of Naturalists, Eugenics Research Association, Eugenics Society (honorary member), and the American Anthropological Association (council member). He was elected a member of the American Association of Physical Anthropologists at the time of its organization (1930); from 1943 to 1946, he served on its Executive Committee; from 1946-1948, he was its vice president.

Steggerda's work focused on birth, growth, and the intermingling of biological strains—the procession of generations in plant, fowl, mammal, and man.

By 1926, young Steggerda, with his training in genetics and psychology, had attracted the attention of Charles Davenport. Under the auspices of the Department of Genetics, Carnegie Institution, together they explored the natives of the British West Indies (1926-1928); out of this there issued not only Steggerda's doctoral dissertation (on the Negro-White hybridizations), but a series of publications, most notably the *Race-Crossing in Jamaica*, under joint authorship of the two collaborators (1929).

Steggerda passed away on March 15, 1950, in Hartford, Connecticut, leaving a son Charles, and wife Inez (Dunkelberger) Steggerda.

73. The Papers of Samuel Simpson, 1868-1954. Author, theologian, painter, state IPACLIANIPYI PROF. OF American Church History at the Hartford Seminary (1903-1909); born in Centreville, Michigan; received his education at Olivet College and Oberlin Theological Seminary; several pastorates at Elk, Minn. (1896-98) and Calderon, Ohio (1898-1900); died in Tolland, Conn. In the Archives are ca. 50 letters (1894-1910) and several papers relating to him. Index available.
74. The Papers of Walter Ralph Steiner, 1870-1942. Born in Frederick City, Md.; was a physician; was Lecturer in Medical Instruction, Kennedy School of Missions (1921-1931); In the Archives are ca. 40 letters (1921-30) and some papers.
75. The Papers of Matthew Spinka, 1890-1972. American Church historian; born in Czechoslovakia; educated at Coe College and Chicago Theological Seminary and taught at the same Seminary (1926-31); taught at the Hartford Seminary Foundation (1941-1958); authority on the Russian Church and author of many books. Died in Claremont, Calif. His papers consist of ca. 300 letters (1941-50), some clippings, and articles; Index to these papers is available. Also in the Archives are 5 document cases containing mass of published and unpublished works, articles, etc.; these are to be organized and listed.
76. The Papers of Douglas Van Steere, 1901- . Author, theologian, educator; born in Harbor Beach, Mich.; studied at Harvard and Oxford universities; taught in the Philosophy Department, Haverford College, Pa. (1928-64); he was the Carew Lecturer at the Hartford Seminary Foundation (1944-45); lives in Haverford, Pa. In the Archives are ca. 40 letters and some papers; Index available.
77. The Papers of Morris Steggarda, 1900-1990. Author, theologian, anthropologist; authority on the Maya Indians at Yucatan. Born in Holland Mich., studied at the University of Illinois, worked in Jamaica as a Researcher from the Carnegie Institute of Washington; had been in Yucatan, Navajo reservations, and Mexico; was Prof. of Anthropology in the Anthropology Department of the Kennedy School of Missions, ESP (1944-50); His papers in the Archives consist of ca. 300 letters (1941-50) and ca. 100 miscellaneous papers relating to him; Index to these papers is available. Presently in the Archives are also 47 document boxes (ca. 20 linear feet) containing field note books (1931-36), 15 scrap books (personal, on birds, sciences, North America, peoples of the world, food, plants, Jamaica, etc.), 12 note books on relations of unsorted documents, character sketches, etc., 4 note books on Navajo (1935-37), scrap books, clippings, notes, etc.; a diary (1948-50), hymnals, 1 note book on "Bible Reading"; papers relating to the Navajo culture, mission study (unpublished), Yale anthropological studies; and hundreds of letters (1935-1950); in the Archives is also his index on anthropology, biology, genetics, etc. in 9 metal drawers. (We must remember here that upon Mrs. Steggarda's request on February 15, 1974, 51 document cases full of Steggarda's research papers and reports including pictures on Jamaica studies, on the Maya Indians, Yucatan, and Mexico, papers relating to the Jamaica studies, the Tuskegee papers, etc., all raw research material, were transferred to the University of Connecticut at Storrs, Conn.).
78. The Papers of Russell Henry Stafford, 1890-1971. Theologian; born in Wauwatosa, Wis.; studied at the Univ. of Minn., Drew Theological Seminary, and Chicago Theological Seminary; was minister of the Old Church in Boston (1927-45); President of the Hartford Seminary Foundation (1945-58); author of a few books; died in Hartford, Conn. In the Archives we have ca. 8,500 letters (1945-58), miscellaneous items (1927-58) including sermons, articles, notes, clippings, and pictures. Index to the papers is available.
79. The Papers of Karl Ruf Stols, 1884-1943. Theologian, educator; author of many books; born in Traverse City, Mich; received his education in a number of colleges and universities; was the Dean of the Hartford School of Religious Education, Hartford Seminary Foundation (1927-43) and was in the same school Prof. of English Bible (1927-43). In the Archives are ca. 130 letters (1927-43) and ca. 30 items including some clippings, articles, etc. Index to his papers is available.
